


Set up a JustGiving page

JustGiving allows people to donate to your cake sale without using cash, they can pay securely online knowing that their donation will be going directly towards supporting our lifesaving services.



This might be in your garden or outside your front door. You could even host your bake sale online - by taking a picture of your tasty treats and posting on your social media channels - your friends and family won't be able to resist!

Create your cake stall

Whether you choose to set up an honesty pot or use JustGiving, sell your bakes. Why not set up a telephone service where people can donate via JustGiving and collect their cake from you at a specified time?

£5 could pay for pressure dressings to control a patients bleeding.

Hints and tips

- Livestream the making of your delicious cakes or perhaps your cake selling stall on the day! You can add a livestream video to your JustGiving page too, making it easier for you to encourage supporters to donate through the duration of your fundraiser.

- Take orders from family and friends and take their donations in advance of your sale.
- Have you found a particular treat that went down a real storm and was a particular sell-out at your sale? How about challenging friends to a virtual bake off? Ask your friends to donate via JustGiving to take part, take pictures of your entries then ask people, followers or supporters to cast their vote on social media.
- Use the cake toppers we've provided to show your buyers that you're supporting your local air ambulance.

Recipe ideas

Crunchy chewy rice crispy cakes

Ingredients

- 200g soft butter toffees
- 200g white marshmallows
- 50g butter, plus extra for greasing
- 65g Rice Krispies

How to make them

- 1. Melt the butter in a very big saucepan (large enough to fit all the ingredients).
- 2. Add the toffees and melt them slowly in the butter (stirring continuously until melted).
- 3. Add the marshmallows and continue heating and stirring until they have melted.
- 4. Add the Rice Krispies, stirring and folding until the mixture completely covers all the ingredients. Do this over a gentle heat to keep the mixture free (don't worry it will go really stringy when stirring it). You may need to add more crispies if necessary.
- 5. Grease a tin (around 20cm square) with a little butter and line with baking parchment (this is important or they will stick to the dish) then empty the mixture into the tray. Press down with a metal spoon (as this won't stick to the mix) and leave to cool.
- 6. Cut into squares then serve. If not serving straight away store in layers with baking parchment underneath and in between.
