Appendix 1 - Tasking system for patients in cardiac arrest

IMMEDIATE TAAS dispatch:

- Age < 16 years
- Pregnant patient in cardiac arrest
- Cardiac arrest during sporting activity

Probable TAAS dispatch – ALS Special Circumstances

- Cardiac arrest secondary to anaphylaxis
- Cardiac arrest secondary to asthma
- Cardiac arrest secondary to hypothermia likely witnessed submersion injury
- Diving emergency
- Cardiac arrest secondary to drowning
- Sustained ROSC and significant time to hospital
- Remote location
- Crew requests for specific extended skills call to be interrogated and discussion with TAAS clinical team

Do NOT dispatch TAAS

- 3rd party call or no bystander CPR
- Resident of elderly/residential care home (even if CPR/AED in progress)
- DNAR/RESPECT/End of life care plan in place
- Signs of obvious death
- Known terminal or life limiting illness
- High Clinical frailty score as evidenced by:
 - Need for carers for daily activities
 - Unable to leave house unaided
 - o Bed bound
