This booklet is full of really useful information about the important work of Your Local Air Ambulance. Plus you can find lots of really fun ways you can help us by raising money!

#### What does Your Local Air Ambulance do?

Every day of the year, The Air Ambulance Service is helping save more lives. Our critical care paramedics, doctors and pilots attend an average of eight rescue missions a day. Within minutes they can be on the ground delivering lifesaving care at road traffic collisions, sports events, and industrial accidents or for medical emergencies such as cardiac arrest, stroke or accidents in the home. The charity receives **no government funding** and we rely entirely on donations to raise the £1,700 we need for each rescue mission. **Your support will help keep us flying.** 



Our team are supported by **CRITICAL CARE CARS**, these provide valuable backup for incidents close to the helicopter base, or when the weather makes it too dangerous to fly. It also enables our doctors and critical care paramedics to run a night car service, as we don't operate our helicopter service after dark. This means we are available to reach those in need 24 hours a day, seven days a week, 365 days a year!

We fly two super fast AgustaWestland 109 helicopters, at a top speed of 185mph.

We receive no funding from the government, it costs £1,700 on average for each life saving mission we fly.

Our two helicopters cover over 3,850 square miles with a population of over 3.2 million people.



Jack's Story

Schoolboy Jack Simons was airlifted to the Queen's Medical Centre in Nottingham after he was knocked off his bike, dragged under a bus and trapped for over an hour on a busy main road in Leicester.

It took Derbyshire, Leicestershire & Rutland Air Ambulance just seven minutes to fly him to the urgent medical care he needed after the bus was lifted off the ground and Jack was freed.

The 12-year-old had sustained a broken left leg and, luckily, no other injuries despite his horrific ordeal.

His Dad Darren says: "When my son needed help Your Local Air Ambulance was there for him. It could have been a life or death situation but thankfully it wasn't and he was lucky that his injuries weren't more serious."

Your Local Air Ambulance does not receive any funding from the Government and we are lifted in the air purely through kind people like you, who choose to fundraise for us. Take a look at how your money and donations can help.

> Could pay for straps to safely secure patients before and during their flight, allowing our crew to focus on treatment.

Could pay for pressure dressings to control a patient's bleeding. Could pay for essential pads to be used with a defibrillator when a patient suffers cardiac arrest.

The average cost of a mission is **£1,700** so every penny you raise helps to keep our helicopters in the air.



Could pay for a vacuum splint, used to support and hold fractured limbs during transport to hospital.
