TOGETHER WE CAN BE THERE FOR MORE FAMILIES



We're proud to share a monumental milestone: our 1,000th vital transfer! Since taking off in 2013, we've been dedicated to supporting critically ill babies and children across the UK with rapid air transfers, ensuring they reach the specialist care they need when every second counts.

Our service is made possible through strong partnerships with 11 fantastic NHS Clinical Partner Teams (CPT). These partnerships allow us to provide seamless, expert care during transfers, giving even the tiniest patients the best chance at recovery. In July 2024, our G-NICU helicopter marked our 1,000th transfer by transferring a neonatal patient with Embrace from Liverpool to Chesterfield in just 33 minutes, a journey that would have taken over two hours by road. This milestone highlights the life-changing impact our air transfers have on young lives and their families.

Alfie Daly, Head of Operations, reflected: "Reaching 1,000 transfers shows the dedication of everyone involved, from our aircrew to the teams behind the scenes. Our bespoke incubators have been a game-changer, allowing us to help more neonatal patients. We're incredibly proud of our ongoing partnerships with the CPTs we work with. Together we are able to support so many families when they need us most, and we look forward to continuing to work with them and helping more critically ill babies and children."

With advanced in-flight care like ECMO (extracorporeal membrane oxygenation) and nitric oxide, we remain at the forefront of aeromedical transfers. Chris Bailey, Associate Director of Operations, added: "Our mission is to evolve alongside NHS teams, providing cutting-edge care for critically ill babies and children. None of this would be possible without the generosity of our supporters."

Each transfer costs around £3,600, and as a donation-funded charity, we rely on your support. Your contributions enable us to reach more young patients, keeping families together, and providing world-class care. Thank you for believing in us—here's to saving the next 1,000 young lives!

BEHIND THE Rotors

YORKSHIRE'S FAVOURITE CHARITY SHOP



The Children's Air Ambulance works with 11 amazing NHS Clinical Partner Teams (CPTs), each playing a vital role in saving young lives. Over the coming editions, we'll be taking you 'Behind The Rotors' and introduce you to these teams and the WATCh's skilled team includes consultants. incredible work they do.

First up is WATCh - the Wales & West Acute Transport for Children service. WATCh provides round-the-clock clinical advice and inter-hospital transport for seriously ill children across South Wales and Southwest England. A partnership between the paediatric intensive care units (PICUs) in Cardiff and Bristol, the team ensures critically unwell children receive expert care as quickly as possible.

When hospitals contact WATCh for advice, the team develops a management plan tailored to each case. This may involve supporting care locally or arranging urgent transfers to a PICU. WATCh prioritises finding a local bed in Cardiff or Bristol, but

if these are unavailable, they secure the nearest suitable option. For children with specific needs, such as cardiac care, Bristol serves as the regional specialist centre.

nurses, and advanced practitioners with expertise in paediatric intensive care, anaesthesia, and emergency medicine. Every child's transfer is carefully planned in collaboration with the referring and receiving hospitals. The Children's Air Ambulance works closely with WATCh to transfer children to specialist hospitals or back to local hospitals after treatment, ensuring families are reunited sooner. Together, we're committed to providing the highest standard of care. Beyond their lifesaving work, WATCh also provides education and support to regional hospitals through outreach roadshows, sharing knowledge to improve care for all.

PATIENT STORY

Elsie's Story

When baby Elsie was born, her parents, Becky and Damian, had no idea anything was wrong. But within days, their world was turned upside down when she was diagnosed with a life-threatening congenital heart condition. Thanks to a crucial helicopter transfer by the Children's Air Ambulance, Elsie's life was saved, giving her a chance at the future she deserves.


"She would've died, no two ways about it." says Damian. "Our family would've been lost; I don't know how you'd come back from something like that."

Elsie's condition, Transposition of the Great Arteries, meant her heart's main arteries were reversed. This caused oxygenated blood to circle back to her lungs while deoxygenated blood flowed around her body, depriving her organs of oxygen. A chance observation of her swollen hands and feet during a routine check uncovered the issue.

Doctors at North Devon District Hospital knew she needed urgent surgery at Bristol Children's Hospital. But the two-hour drive could have been fatal. Partnering with the Wales and West Acute Transport for Children (WATCh) team, we transferred Elsie in just 24 minutes, giving her the chance she desperately needed.

Before the flight, Elsie's condition worsened, leaving her gasping for air. It took four hours to stabilise her enough for the journey. "It was getting close to dark, but the pilot was keen to take off and she probably wouldn't have made it if we hadn't." Damian recalls.





For Damian, the experience was overwhelming. "We'd tried for four years to have a baby, and now my daughter could die in front of me while my wife was 150 miles away in another hospital. I'd never cried so much in my life." he says. Thankfully, the surgery was a success. "The surgeon found us after five and a half hours. My heart sank when I saw him, but he told us everything had gone really well." Damian remembers. "When we saw her, her chest was closed, and she was off the bypass machine. All I wanted then was to see her open her eyes again." The next morning, Damian got his wish. "I said 'morning' to her like I always do, and she started to open her eyes. I called Becky straight away, and she came to see Elsie moving around for the first time."

Now seven years old, Elsie is thriving. She loves singing, dancing, and bringing joy to those around her. "She's such a funny little girl." says Damian. Damian remains eternally grateful to the Children's Air Ambulance. "The speed and time saved by the helicopter made a massive impact. Without you, Elsie wouldn't be here." he says.
